




Approach: Draw your Knowledge

In the University of Humanities and Economics in Lodz (AHE), Kamila Witerska has been using the Draw your knowledge method with her teacher training course which is run with a small group of students.

Here are the steps Kamila takes with the class in applying this method:

<p>Kamila first invites her students in groups of four to collect information of three models of education based on psychological theories:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Behavioural• Cognitive• Humanistic	
<p>Groups present the results of their investigation to the student group as a whole.</p>	
<p>Students are invited to draw their knowledge, trying to find a metaphor for the model and add all the important information they can find to the model.</p>
